

How to keep a music score and Zoom side to side on screen on a Mac - if using a PC your controls are different but the sequence to proceed is the same.

1. Position the pdf music files on your desktop or know how to access and open them easily in your files.
2. Open a music file, if the page occupies the entire screen, hover with your mouse on the right side of the page and drag the side of the page to the left to the required size.
3. You are aiming at keeping your file open on the left side of your screen and navigating from page to page as if turning a score page.



4. To navigate from one score page to the next, click on the up or down arrows.

5. Open your email invitation, click on the meeting link. When Zoom is open:

- hover your mouse on the left hand side of the Zoom screen.
- drag the edge of the window to the right until your music score shows entirely.

- you are aiming at music window on the left and zoom window on the right.
